Who can apply for EMA - Educational Maintenance Allowance?



EMA is available to eligible people aged 16 to 19 who have reached school leaving age. To be eligible, you have to meet the following criteria:

Household income

Your household income will also determine if you're eligible for EMA. Household income is the income of your parent(s) or carer(s) who live with you.

To qualify, households with one dependent child must be earning **£24,421** per year or less, and households with more than one dependent child must be earning **£26,884** or less, before tax. (Dependent children are those up to the age of 16 and those between the age of 16 and 25 in full time further or higher education).

When applying for EMA, you will be asked to upload screenshots / photos of the following evidence as set out in table below:

You can only qualify for EMA if you're either:

- attending school full time
- taking part in a learning agreement/action plan (previously known as jumpstart / activity agreement)
- on a full or part-time non-advanced course in a college or education centre.
 You can only get EMA if you're on a non-advanced course (those studying up to and including Advanced Highers at both school and college). If you are not sure if your course qualifies as non-advanced, you should speak to your learning provider.

How do I apply for EMA?

If you're eligible for an Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA), you must complete the following every academic year:

- an EMA online application
- a learning agreement

For the academic year 2023/24 we introduced an on-line application form for pupils applying for EMA. This will simplify and speed up the application and award process.

The on-line form is accessible through Clackmannanshire Council website using the following link: https://www.clacks.gov.uk/learning/emas/

You will need to register for a user account before you start entering you information. This will allow you to save your application and return to it later to submit if required.

Please Note: You will need to complete the application with your parent/carer present as some of the questions relate to their circumstances, and they need to sign the declaration.

You will be able to submit supporting information as part of the application process. This will remove the requirement for an appointment with the Education Team at Kilncraigs to provide evidence.

As stated above, you will be required to upload Photos / Screenshots of the required evidence as part of the application. Please ensure that you have the relevant supporting information / proof of benefits required before starting your application.

If you do not upload the required information, you will be contacted by email.

You will be advised by email if your application has been successful / rejected.

We will be accepting online applications from August 2023. Please see below table that sets out when you are eligible to apply:

What is a Learning Agreement?

A learning agreement sets out what's expected of you in terms of attendance and coursework. Your learning agreement is set by your school and takes your personal circumstances into account.

It must be signed by:

- you
- your parent or responsible adult
- the school or college you're studying at

Parental signature is not required if you:

- are studying full time within college
- are estranged from your family and assessed as independent for benefit purposes
- have additional support needs that make it impractical

A new learning agreement should be completed for each academic year.

When are payments made?

Providing that you have 100% of agreed weekly attendance at school or college, the EMA payment will be made into your own bank account. Payments are made on a fortnightly basis in arrears and the payment start date depends on the date of your 16th birthday. Your will receive notification of payment dates upon successful application.

Your council or college may stop EMA payments if you don't follow your learning agreement.

What happens next?

Once you have submitted your application form with the supporting evidence, your application will be assessed by the Council's Education Service.

If your application is successful, you will receive an email confirming your EMA start date and details of future payments. The payments will be made to your Bank Account.

You must complete your Learning Agreement. Your School office will be able to provide you with the form. This should be completed and signed off by your Guidance Teacher. Please note: We are unable to start your payments until a signed Learning Agreement is received.
