#### 1.0 Purpose

1.1 To present the proposed plans to launch the Game On programme in the Tullibody area

#### 2.0 Recommendations

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee note and comment on the development of the partnership and the contents of this paper.

#### 3.0 Considerations

- 3.1 The proposed programme has been developed in partnership to address community concerns around the rise in anti social behaviour amongst local young people following the initial lock down during the COVID 19 pandemic.
- 3.2 The programme has been funded for 32 weeks and will be led by Coalfields Regeneration Trust in partnership with Education Community Learning and Development team
- 3.3 The programme will be carried out on a Friday evening and commence on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> 6.00 8.00 pm September 2021through to the end of June 22.
- 3.4 Initially the football programme will run from the Tullach campus with proposed access to the Civic Centre for toilets and refreshments
- 3.5 Due to the lack of lighting in the evening, it is proposed that the programme will move the Civic centre after the October school holiday where young people can participate in football and other activities delivered by partners
- 3.6 Staff will work co-productively with young people to design a programme exploring youth issues faced by young people, and incorporate sessions around harm reduction and personal and community safety.
